Michael was invited to Washington DC to participate in part of the Washington-Ireland Program for Leadership and Service (WIP) and, in this way, began to explore the possibility of establishing the South Africa-Washington Internship Program (SAWIP). He graduated from the University of Cape Town with a BSc in Electromechanical Engineering. He was involved, with others, in the development of SAWIP from its initial exploratory phase, through its pilot years to its full establishment. He served as the Manager of the 2007 and 2008 SAWIP Teams, as a board member, and, is an honorary SAWIP Alumnus. In 2014 he received a Master's Degree in Innovation Design Engineering at the Royal School of Art and Imperial College, London, as a Chevening Scholar. He is currently founder and CEO of PixelBlue Innovations, a design and

innovation start-up.
